
Oktoberfest in Leavenworth | 18 yrs - adult


Leavenworth Christmas Tree Lighting Festival | 18 yrs - adult





Swim Lesson Registration Information & Tips

Please be sure you are registering for the correct level. Transfers between classes will be made only if space is available. Our lessons fill quickly!

If you are new to our swim lesson program, to register for any level above penguin, a swim test is required for enrollment. Swim tests are offered for free at any open swim, see page 33 for open swim details. Advanced levels include: Otter, Seal, Dolphin, and Marlin.

- It is very common for swimmers to repeat levels. Keep in mind, they are still learning and gaining valuable practice time.
- Group lessons have a maximum enrollment of 6 swimmers per instructor. The Sea Horse class has an enrollment maximum of 15 swimmers.
- Please do not register for a higher level until you receive an instructor evaluation card indicating they have accomplished the required skills. For example, register for Penguin for the first and second sessions. If the swimmer has passed a level and we are unable to transfer them into a higher level, the instructor can provide the swimmer more challenging skills. If they have not passed and are mistakenly registered for a higher level, it is likely there won't be an opening to transfer to and the only option may be to cancel from that session.
- Changes in registration will be made only upon your request by calling the Lacey Parks and Recreation office and if space is available.
- Don't be discouraged if a class is full, we often add classes based on the waitlist. If you are registering online you can add yourself to any waitlist or call our office.



Swim Lesson Levels

Sea Horse | 1 - 4 yrs

No pre-requisite skills required. At least one adult is required to be in the water with the swimmer. Class focus is on water comfort through songs, games, and basic swimming skills.

Sea Puffer | 3.5 - 5 yrs

No pre-requisite skills required. For beginner swimmers ready to follow instructions and be in a class without a parent. The class is taught on an underwater platform to make the water shallower and more comfortable for the swimmers.

Penguin | 4.5 yrs & older

No pre-requisite skills required. This is a beginner class. Students should be comfortable in the water and able to hang onto the side of the pool in water that is 4 feet deep.

Teen | 12 - 17 yrs

Designed for teen swimmers with little or no swim experience and would feel more comfortable with participants closer to their own age.

To enroll in an advanced level such as Otter, Seal, Dolphin or Marlin new swimmers are required to take a swim test. Current swimmers can enroll for an advanced level if they have an instructor evaluation card indicating they have accomplished the required skills.

Jacob Smith House

Constructed in 1859, prior to the Civil War, the Jacob Smith House is the oldest home in Lacey and one of the oldest residences in Thurston County. The Greek Revival-style structure, with its signature square water tower, is located in Lacey Corporate Center. It is listed on the city and state registers of historic places. Newspaper accounts from the mid-1890's reported that the Smith residence was "noted for its hospitality and good cheer"



and served as the scene of many social gatherings in the community. More than a century later, the house once again serves this function hosting weddings, reunions, meetings and retreats.


